
# From the Editor

I would also like to remind the membership that club rules require all members to display

a club-issued membership card while using our facilities. We have a large membership, including a lot of new members, and it's imperative that we know who is using our field! If you are flying an aircraft, you can, for example, place your membership card on the 'Pin Pole', or wear the card around your neck using a lanyard. Car track users can also use lanyards or clip the membership card to their outer clothing. We will continue to enforce these two requirements in the coming months, so be sure to bring your member cards to the field! Lanyards are available for all members. Please see me to get your free lanyard!

# **Plane Sense Field Trip**

**O**n Saturday, Sept. 21<sup>st</sup>, the 495<sup>th</sup> R/C Squadron conducted a field trip to PlanseSense in Portsmouth, NH. PlaneSense is a world class fractional aircraft ownership company based at the Portsmouth International Tradeport. PlaneSense currently operates a mixed fleet consisting of the Pilatus PC-21 turboprop and PC-24 turbofan aircraft. This event was hosted by member Mark Pied of PlaneSense.



Meeting at the Pinnacle St. flying field at 9AM, the group split into manageable car pool groups, and got underway for the 45 minute ride to Portsmouth at about 9:45AM.

Upon our arrival, and following a quick introduction to the company and a mandatory safety briefing, our group of 17 members was escorted to the main PlaneSense maintenance hangar where we spend about 90 minutes looking at PC-12 and PC-24 aircraft in various states of disassembly, and asking loads of questions! Our host, Mark Pied, patiently described each aircraft, the in-progress maintenance operation, and answered all our questions!!

# 'N' Gauge Model Railroad Presentation

At the October 5th, 2024 club meeting, member Fay Chin, ably assisted by his wife, Jane, presented a complete operating table top N gauge model railroad layout. Built using the modular T-TRAK concept, the layout was completed over a number of years, and featured many scale details designed and 3D printed or laser cut by Fay. These features included a working drawbridge, loads of LED lighting, and many scale structures around the layout!

Fay's presentation also featured a discussion of the Arduino microcontrollers used to control animation and lighting around the layout, as well as the techniques used to design and 3D print & laser cut components in the layout. A tutorial of the software used in the design and fabrication of these components was also presented.

Building and showing such an intricate model railroad layout takes an enormous amount of skill and patience! Fay and his wife Jane travel all over the New England region every year attending model train shows to display his layout, and to network with other like-minded railroad modelers!

Thank you Fay and Jane for sharing your passion!


# Fay Chin's Model Railroad

At the October 2nd club meeting, member Fay Chin proudly presented some of his model train layout. The N scale model was an impressive display that spanned almost the entire width of the club meeting room. For those unfamiliar with N scale model railroading, this scale is the second smallest in size. Only the Z scale is smaller. After a little bit of research, I found the N scale is the second most popular scale in North America, and many hobbyists find it appealing because one can add quite a bit of scale detail into a smaller space. For reference, N scale has a model to full size ratio of about 1:160. Fay mentioned that he has even more scenic railroads set up at home and frequently attends many local model railroad shows. His arsenal of model railroad trains, layouts and animations is truly impressive. During our monthly meeting, the layout only required two full size folding tables placed together. In an upcoming show, Fay has requested 100 tables for the layout! He and his fellow model railroaders are sure to put on an outstanding display of the world in 1:160 scale.

The model railroad featured many buildings, roads, cars and trucks, and even a scale container ship. There were several features that had animations like drawbridges and a coal dumper. A scale solar farm used functioning photovoltaic cells that actually produced a voltage when in light. A meter displayed the voltage output for this solar farm and a similar meter displayed voltage output from scale wind turbines at the other end of the display. All of the lights were soldered by hand and there were many of them to add a sense of realism to the layout. The N scale requires a steady, skilled hand when wiring the tiny wires, LEDs, and control boards. Fay's years as an electrical engineer are certainly evident in his model railroad displays.





Fay shared with us some of the components he uses when constructing his model railroad worlds. There were plenty of samples passed around the room so that members could see firsthand some of the control boards, servos, and other electronic components that are needed to make the miniature world come to life. The detail on the handcrafted buildings is remarkable. These buildings can literally fit in the palm of your hand and have exquisite detail at such a small scale. To construct many of these railroad accessories, Fay used 3-D printing and laser cutting. He shared with us many of his custom models and the techniques he used to build them. Just like with our model aircrafts, the hobbyist must be skilled in many areas to build such convincing replicas of the real world.

Please enjoy some photos of Fay's model railroad display. There is even a short video of his layout at our October meeting. Thank you for sharing your hobby with us!




